Our dear, darling, unbelievably devoted Scully has a lovely penchant for being *present*. She is not a dog who enjoys being on her own, doing her own thing, at least not when Ben and I are home. When we're gone, sure,

she absolutely enjoys the wonders of having the recliner and all the blankets to herself, enjoys not having her naps interrupted by our jostling her out of our laps or making unnecessary noise, but she's making it very well known that she much prefers life when we are home, when we're with her, when we're all together. Scully is also not a dog that gives even the remotest care for personal space, her own or yours. She is not the dog who has her own niche on the couch, separate and away from everyone else; she is not the dog who lays on the floor while everyone else occupies the chairs, no, she is very much a where you are, there I shall be too type of pup.

We've known this about Scully since we got her. It's part of who she is, cuddly, must be right by your side at all times, and she has been that way since she was eight weeks old. While I've known this though, sometimes I don't really think about it. Well, let me tell you, recently, I thought about it. Throughout the month of April, my gym has been sponsoring what they lovingly call "Ab April," a cutesy way of describing the fact that they were planning on putting all of our stomach muscles through the ringer for all of April. We've all been issued weekly challenges to work on in order to build our muscles, with the expectation that we will do some when we are there, but that we will also do them when we are home on our own. Well, let me tell you, never in my life have I been more aware of Scully's desire to be present then when I have been on the floor of the living room attempting to maintain an elbow plank while she is standing in front of me, staring directly at me and simultaneously trying to lick my nose.

Lessons of Scully

Ever tried to do sit ups with a dog circling your every move? It's not fun. It's *funny*, but laughing is not exactly conducive to working out, so it's been a *challenge*...this attempt to work my abs in the midst of a dog who enjoys being *present*.

All of this has gotten me thinking about how being present is just another item on the massive list of ways that we can learn to be more human, more loving from our pets. Maybe it seems odd, but there are days when Scully is the greatest reminder of God's love I have ever experienced —unconditional, fearless, immense, joyful, incomprehensible. I never cease to learn what it is to love when the lesson is coming from my continually loving puppy. This lesson about presence though, that's been a new one.

Do you ever think about the fact that while we are involved in more people's lives than we can probably count through the connections of social media, our iobs, our families, life in general, but how many of those people are we actually present for? How many people do you actually look in the eyes and listen to when they're talking, when they're sharing? How many people in your life are you present with so deeply that it would be akin to staring at them while they hold a plank? Being together is such a gift, it might be one of the greatest gifts that we've ever received from God, this gift that we were made for community, connection, for each other, and yet those are the moments that far too often we let slip by. We're deep in conversation, while also checking every time our phone buzzes at us; we're talking about our days with the TV droning on in the background drawing half of our attention; we're on the phone with a loved one while doing a hundred other things on the other line. We are there, but we aren't always present.

Maybe the greatest lesson we can learn from our pets is to be present with each other, to be connected with each other, to see each other with eyes that take in the hurt, the joy, the questions, the wonder, the need that is staring back at us just waiting to be seen for what it is. Because that's also the thing with

pets—they *see* us. They see our needs, which somehow is mind-blowing, but they know when we need their presence just a little bit more, when we need affection, when we need a cuddle buddy, when we need to play, when we need to laugh. May we all see each other in the same way, may we all be so attentive as to recognize when our siblings in Christ are standing in front of us incapable of vocalizing their needs, but needing us to *see* them anyway. May

we be present with each other—wholly and completely, not distracted, not detached, not halfway—but fully, fully present.

We are gifts to each other, each and every one of us, so may we all be so present as to not miss what is right in front of us.

A Note on Hymnody

In the Lutheran Church, we are blessed to have inherited a wonderful musical tradition going back to Luther himself. We have a wealth of beautiful hymns from which to choose each week, and new ones are being written all of the time.

Selecting the hymns for each Sunday's worship can be a daunting task. The ELCA provides a yearly guide for worship planning called <u>Sundays and Seasons'</u> which includes suggested hymns for each Sunday. Our Director of Music, Rob Keene, and Pastor Tina plan each service carefully, keeping in mind the theme of the day, the appointed lessons and prayer for that day, and any special events which may be happening.

The gathering and sending hymns do just what their names suggest: gather us in for worship and send us out into the world to share the Good News. The Hymn of the Day serves as the congregation's proclamation of the theme as set forth in the lessons and the sermon. Hymns during Communion

highlight the message of communion, as well as the theme of the day.

We all have our own favorite hymns, which can evoke a multitude of memories and emotions. While we can't each sing our particular favorites each Sunday, we can be assured that the hymns we sing each week have been chosen specifically for their relevance to the theme of the day's worship.

If a hymn seems unfamiliar to you, here are a few suggestions to make you feel more comfortable and able to participate in the communal singing which is such an integral part of our Lutheran worship experience. Listen as the organist plays the introduction; you may realize that you've heard that tune before. Read through the words; they are as important as the tune. If you still don't feel comfortable singing, follow along in your hymnal for the message that the words convey.

Lutherans sing, and we sing boldly! Lift your voices to the praise of God!


The Youth Group would like to sincerely thank all the congregation members who have supported us


