

From the Pastor's Desk . . .



In her book *Inspired*, Rachel Held Evans says this, "So when someone asks, 'What is the gospel?' the best response is, 'Let me tell you a story."' She says this in reflection of one simple reality, our connection to the gospel, our connection

to the church in so many ways is tied to the stories we tell, and each of us has a unique one to share with people. She talks about the fact that this is why we have four gospel narratives, Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John all have different versions of their story to share. The thing is though, we've moved a bit away from this reality. When someone asks us what we believe or what the gospel is or why we go to church or where we find the church, we tend to fall back on rote statements, we give them the cerebral, bare bones facts of who, what, where, and how, without telling them what any of those things actually *mean* to us, how they have actually impacted our lives, and who we are. We've stopped telling the stories of our faith.

Part of it is that telling those stories is to put yourself in an immensely vulnerable position. It means opening up a part of your heart that is intimate and personal and probably a part that we've told ourselves doesn't belong to anyone else but ourselves. Yet, stories, tangible, personal stories of faith, of church, of life are the best possible ways in which we can even come close to describing to people what we experience when we experience joy, hope, grace, faith, and love. Jesus did it too, all the time. He wanted people to understand what the kingdom he was coming to usher in looked like or would be like, he didn't give them some laundry list of details, some detached description, he gave them a story. The kingdom of God is like...farmer's fields and wedding banquets and family relationships and fig trees and lost sheep. Stories are what brought the kingdom of God into bright, brilliant

color for those who heard Jesus speak and those stories do the same thing for us. They help us grasp a little bit clearer what God's intentions for us are, they help us learn what the kingdom of God might look like in 21st century America, they help us see that maybe we need to start telling our own stories, our own modern day parables in order to help people see, feel, touch, understand what we mean when we say that we believe in Jesus, when we say that we have a church family, when we say that God loves us.

So, if someone were to ask me, "What is the gospel?" I might say something like this...

Let me tell you the story of when my pastors gathered our Confirmation class to help prepare for Rally Day, and a bunch of grumbly pre-teens wanted nothing to do with it. They walked us into the church and then told us to head up to our sanctuary's balcony-where most of us tended to gather in worship if we weren't sitting with our families. Once we got there, they handed us all buckets filled with...candy, and then they told us that our one job was to literally throw handfuls of candy off of the balcony to be scattered around the sanctuary, because that was how we were kicking off Sunday school that year, by letting all the kids younger than us run through the sanctuary and gather up as much candy as they could. They of course laid down rules, don't peg the stained glass windows, don't throw the candy at each other, be good, but mostly, they just wanted us to have fun. So, a bunch of previously cranky middle schoolers ended up laughing hysterically from the front of that balcony watching candy fly into the pews below us, and somehow in that moment, I found church...a place where I could have fun with my friends, where we could be a little bit goofy, where our pastors knew what we needed in order to fully engage with the congregational life going on around us.

Let me tell you the story of Nancy and Donald Hain who immediately invited me over for lunch when I was internship because Nancy had found out I had never had the Pennsylvania Dutch potluck staple of chicken corn soup. We sat around their kitchen table with big heaping bowls of soup in the middle of an exceedingly hot August day, and Nancy told me about how her mom taught her how to make this exact recipe that was now in countless iterations of church cookbooks. After lunch, Donald took me out and showed me his woodworking shop where he crafted immaculate bird houses. Before I left, he had me pick one out to take home...Ben and I still have it and use it to this day. In that one afternoon, I found church...a place where the gospel happens over steaming bowls of soup and in the sharing of gifts and talents.

We all could fill books with the stories that have brought us the gospel, brought us church, brought

Our Organ's 50th Anniversary

In 1969, Trinity's organ was dedicated on the second Sunday of Advent. Where were you in December of that year? I wasn't born, of course; neither was my older sister (she was still another thirteen months away). One point of reference for context: Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin walked on the moon just the previous summer. If you're going to share your anniversary year, you might as well share it with the moon landing!

We'll celebrate this auspicious occasion appropriately. On the second Sunday of Advent -December 8th this year - Trinity will offer a concert that features our organ in all its various roles: music for organ alone, a concerto for organ, strings, and timpani, choral and solo vocal works accompanied by the organ, and one of Bach's most famous Advent cantatas. First we'll tip our cap to the instrument's French heritage with music by Elsa Barraine, Francis Poulenc, and Louis Vierne before featuring Lutheran works by Bach, Mendelssohn Bartholdy, and Nilsson. You'll even have the treat of hearing stirring verses from the book of Revelation sung in Swedish. You'll recall that 16th-century Scandinavia enthusiastically adopted the Lutheran Reformation, but even if they hadn't YOU STILL GET TO HEAR SWEDISH!

Each member of Trinity's congregation has the opportunity to be involved in this 50th anniversary celebration. During these Great Fifty Days of Easter, the Worship and Music Committee (and Trinity's church council) invites each member to contribute \$50 to the cause. Your donations will be 1) used to fund December's concert and 2) set aside for future maintenance and repairs, such as our recent refurbishment in 2018. \$50, during the Great 50 Days, for the 50th anniversary. All those 50s seem to make this pretty easy to remember and, hopefully, to get excited about.

KEEP READING FOR THE MOST IMPORTANT TIDBIT: a good friend of Trinity's music ministry has agreed to match your gift! If you make your donation on or before June 9th (Pentecost), every dollar of your generosity will be doubled. If you needed additional incentive to get involved, this is a powerful one.
