



From the Pastor's Desk . . .





From time immemorial, humanity has looked to the night sky for guidance, for direction, for a sense of purpose. I remember being little and my dad would pull out his telescope and head out into our backyard and

watch the stars for hours. Part of the joy of growing up in the country is that there's nothing but cornfields to hinder your view of a crystal clear night sky. We encourage kids to gaze up in the hopes of finding a shooting star to wish upon. Sailors have used the stars to navigate by to guide them home when maps and technology have failed them. The North Star was a promise of hope to slaves escaping towards the North and freedom, a shining beacon in the night that promised if they just kept following it they would find a place where they could live in the fullness that God had promised to all people. The Wise Men followed and followed one bright shining star with the hope that at the end of its path they would find the king they had been promised, one who would change the entire world and turn it upside down. We send wishes up into the night sky like Disney songs have encouraged us to do, that when we wish upon a star, our dreams may come true. We hinge so very much hope upon such tiny pinpricks of light, pinpricks of light that in some ways become the vessels for our fears, our dreams, our prayers...offering up to the night sky what we want to offer up to God.

As we enter into this New Year, this new decade, we, like the Wise Men of old, will look to the stars to see where God may be guiding us and directing us for the year ahead, the years to come. In worship on January 5 (I know, I know, it's a day before Epiphany...hopefully the liturgical gods will forgive me...), you will have the opportunity to pick up when we're calling "Star Words." There will be paper stars around the sanctuary, each with a different word on it, a word that shall be your word of guidance, of hope, of direction for the year. You can choose to seek one specific one out or choose one at random and see what happens, see where you might be being called. As a community of faith, we will commit together to live into these words and let them guide our lives and our faith for the next twelve months, and when next Advent rolls around, we'll have the opportunity to reflect on the impact they've had on us, and we'll be able to share those impacts with each other.

Together, it will be as though we're making a different kind of New Year's resolution. We can strive to go to the gym more or eat less sugar or spend more time in quiet, but there's something powerful in taking up one solitary word, one solitary mantra and letting it be our touchstone, our North Star for the year, to let it weave its influence through every facet of our lives. It can be so easy to get caught up in the everyday movement of life once the New Year kicks in and takes off. Our resolutions last a few weeks and eventually get relegated to the corner to gather dust because life continues to happen and it's difficult to keep our focus. Maybe this year, just having this one word, this one point of direction will keep us grounded, keep our eyes ever forward on where God is calling us a people of love and light and hope.

Whatever your own personal resolutions are for the year, my prayer is that together as a family of God, we commit together to making this New Year, this new decade one of renewed hope and promise for us here at Trinity. We are a congregation which is filled with so many amazing talents and gifts, we have so much potential for ministry which can effect kingdom change in our own corner of the world, and I hope that we can begin to take up that challenge, to truly live into who we are called to be as a congregation, as a people of God. This year, we commit to another decade of living, loving, and serving together with the hope that we are able to be God's hands, heart, and voice in the world. We can look to the skies all we want for inspiration, but may this year, we also start looking straight forward to what lies in front of us, a world in need of hope and service, that we're willing to extend so that all of God's children may know love and peace in the midst of this new dawn.


Installation of New Council Members

Don Golden Scholarship at CNU: Update



In 2012 the Congregational Council voted to establish the Donald E. Golden Scholarship Fund at CNU. Scholarship monies would be given to students studying music with the hope that more church musicians would be educated. The goal

was to raise \$20,000 so the scholarship would be self -sustaining and would continue to honor Organist-Emeritus Donald Golden who led Trinity's music program from 1966 until he retired in 1995. CNU has been very patient with Trinity. The church was asked to donate the \$25,000 by 2017. The college has extended the due date to January 31, 2020. If the \$25,000 is not in the account by then, we were told that all monies will go into CNU'S general scholarship fund. No more Donald E. Golden Scholarship Fund. Because of the great need for church musicians and to honor Trinity's Organist-Emeritis, the leadership at Trinity would like to fully fund this scholarship and asks for your help. As of this writing we are about \$4,000 short to meet the endowment.
