## Second Reading: Romans 7:15-25a

Life captive to sin is a catch-22 existence in which we know good but do not do it and do things we know to be wrong. Through Jesus Christ, God has set us free from such a futile existence.

I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. Now if I do what I do not want, I agree that the law is good. But in fact it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. For I know that nothing good dwells

within me, that is, in my flesh. I can will what is right, but I cannot do it. For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do. Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me.

So I find it to be a law that when I want to do what is good, evil lies close at hand. For I delight in the law of God in my inmost self, but I see in my members another law at war with the law of my mind, making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!

## Gospel: Matthew 11:16-19, 25-30

Jesus chides people who find fault with both his ministry and that of John the Baptist. He thanks God that wisdom and intelligence are not needed to receive what God has to offer.

Cont. . . . The youth group has an entire flock of yard flamingos that will be making their way around the congregation over the remainder of the summer as part of their fundraising efforts for National Youth Gathering. So how does this work? One of our youth will pick the first house to get "flocked" and in the middle of the night that particular yard will be decorated. The deal is you HAVE to leave it up for at least 24 hours!! Then YOU get to pick whose house gets decorated next, and pay a fee for flamingo removal (it is a fundraiser after all!!). If you are flocked, instructions will be provided for how to get your flamingos removed. The flock will travel around the congregation for a however many weeks it moves in an effort to help send our kids to Minneapolis next summer.

Now, you may be wondering, what if I don't want my yard flocked? We have an answer for that!! INSURANCE!! Between now and July 10th, you can purchase insurance and put yourself on the "do not flock" list. That way if someone chooses you, we can just say, nope can't do it.
