So that the sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night



Gospel Lesson: John 1:1-14

P: The Holy Gospel of the Lord, according to St. John

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.



A Liturgy of Remembrance with Candle Lighting

First Candle

The first candle we light to remember those persons whom we have loved and lost. We pause to remember their name, their voice, their face, the memory that binds them to us in this season. We hold them before God, giving thanks for their lives in ours. Let us pray:

Lord, we lift up our loved ones to you. We give thanks for the gift of resurrection and the promise that our loved ones are resting in your eternal care. Thank you for the gift each of these people has been in our lives. We pray that on the days that are hard, you fill us with strength and hope for the journey, on the days that are easier, may you walk with us, guiding our steps. Help us to find joy in the people, events and the beauty of nature which surrounds us. May we at all times feel your comforting presence surrounding us. Amen.

Second Candle

The second candle we light is to redeem the pain of loss; the loss of relationships, the loss of jobs and the security they bring, the loss of health in ourselves or in family members, the loss of joy and peace in our lives from the stresses which surround us, the loss and loneliness we experience when the world feels heavy. As we gather up the pain of the past we offer it to you, O God, asking that into our open hands you will place the gift of peace. Let us pray:

God of mystery, we turn our hearts to you. We come before you in need of peace, grateful for the mystery of life and ever keenly aware of your promises of guidance and protection. We want to place our trust in you, but our hearts grow fearful and anxious. We forget so easily that you will be with us in all that we experience. Teach us to be patient with the transformation of our lives and to be open when change comes into our lives. Amen.

Third Candle

The third candle we light for each of us. We offer up to God our pasts, the times of regret and sorrow, the times of mourning, the difficult memories, the times of grief and sadness, and of loneliness and pain. We ask that God take away the darkness. Let us pray:

God of our depths, we ask you to be our guide. Help us to have a strong sense of inner direction and grant that we may have the reassurance of knowing that we are on the right path. Take our lives and use them according to your will. Take all that is lost in us and bring it home with you. Amen.


Fourth Candle

The fourth candle we light as a sign of hope, the hope that the Christmas story offers to us. We invite and celebrate the coming of the One who promises us no more suffering, the One who promises us light. Let us pray: O God, we give you thanks that in the midst of darkness, you promise to a be a light that no darkness can overcome. We give you thanks that you breathe hope into this world and into our hearts. Help us to turn to you when we struggle and when we rejoice. May we feel the joy of your presence with us each and every day, trusting that in all things you walk by our sides. Amen.

Closing Prayer and Lord's Prayer


