

FIRST READING: Jeremiah 14:7-10, 19-22

In a time of drought, the people pray for mercy, repenting of their sins and the sins of their ancestors. They appeal to God to remember the covenant, to show forth God's power, and to heal their land by sending life-giving rain.

Although our iniquities testify against us, act, O Lord, for your name's sake; our apostasies indeed are many, and we have sinned against you.

O hope of Israel, its savior in time of trouble, why should you be like a stranger in the land, like a traveler turning aside for the night?

Why should you be like someone confused, like a mighty warrior who cannot give help? Yet you, O Lord, are in the midst of us, and we are called by your name; do not forsake us!

Thus says the Lord concerning this people:
Truly they have loved to wander,
they have not restrained their feet;
therefore the Lord does not accept them,
now he will remember their iniquity
and punish their sins.

Have you completely rejected Judah?

Does your heart loathe Zion?

Why have you struck us down
so that there is no healing for us?

We look for peace, but find no good;

How dear to me is your dwelling,

My soul has a desire and longing for the courts of the Lord; my heart and my flesh rejoice in the living God.

Even the sparrow has found a home, and the swallow a nest where she may lay her young,

by the side of your altars, O Lord of hosts, my king and my God.

Happy are they who dwell in your house!

They will always be praising you.

Happy are the people whose strength is in you, whose hearts are set on the pilgrims' way.

Those who go through the balsam valley will find it a place of springs, for the early rains have covered it with pools of water.

They will climb from height to height, and the God of gods will be seen in Zion.

SECOND READING: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18

The conclusion of this letter to a young minister offers a final perspective on life from one who faced death. Though others let him down, Paul was sure of his faith in the Lord, who stood by him and lent him strength.


As for me, I am already being poured out as a libation, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. From now on there is reserved for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give me on that day, and not only to me but also to all who have longed for his appearing.

At my first defense no one came to my support, but all deserted me. May it not be counted against them! But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. So I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and save me for his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory forever and ever. Amen.

Jesus also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and regarded others with contempt:" Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."





Remembering, therefore, his death, resurrection, and ascension, we await his coming in glory.


Pour out upon us the Spirit of your love, O Lord, and unite the wills of all who share this heavenly food, the body and blood of Jesus Christ, our Lord;

Anti Defamation League Antisemitism Program: Pastoring the City, an interfaith clergy group working together to serve the people of Newport News, is hosting a program by the Anti Defamation League in response to the traumatic events that have happened in temples and synagogues recently. The ADL will present three Thursday night programs - Oct. 20, 27, and Nov. 3 - on Zoom at 7:00 PM.

Oct. 20 - The History of Antisemitism, presented by Vlad Khaykin. The History of Antisemitism – Join ADL's Director of Programs on Antisemitism, Vlad Khaykin, as he discusses the history of Antisemitism throughout the world. Known as the world's "oldest hatred," this session will focus on where antisemitism started and how it is recognized today.

<u>Oct. 27</u> - **Zionism**: Understanding its History and Contemporary Role in Modern Jewry and Antisemitism. Shaya Lerner will give an overview of the history and evolution of modern-day Zionism and how it is rooted within Jewish identity, as well as what Zionism looks like today, and the role anti-Zionism plays in manifesting antisemitism.




